► New and Important Information

- Due to Montana's two-year hunting season-setting cycle, this year there are hunting districts listed here as "pending" and are highlighted with yellow fill.
- If you want to apply for a permit in one of the pending hunting districts, you should wait for final approval of the 2016 hunting regulations by the Montana Fish & Wildlife Commission. That information will be posted on FWP's website at <http://fwp.mt.gov> on Feb. 16, 2016.
- Most elk hunting districts in Region 2, in Region 3 HDs 318, 335, 339, 343, and in Region 6 HDs 620, 621, 622, 630, 631, 632, 680, 690 are proposed to offer "antlerless elk permits" instead of, or in addition to, elk B licenses. If you seek to harvest an antlerless elk using an antlerless permit in those hunting districts, you must apply for an antlerless elk permit by March 15. The deadline to apply for elk B licenses is June 1.
- Youth using the new apprentice licenses are not eligible to apply for permits with a limited quota.
- A conservation license and the new base hunting license are required as a prerequisite to obtain a hunting license.
- If you hunt during an archery season, including with an archery only permit, you are required to purchase a 2016 bow and arrow license.
- Any applications without the correct five-digit hunting district permit code will be removed from the drawing.

THIS APPLICATION PACKAGE IS FOR NONRESIDENT COMBINATION LICENSES AND ELK AND DEER PERMITS.

APPLY BY March 15 USING THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

1. Choose the Nonresident Combination License for which you wish to apply:

Big Game Combination (\$1001) General Elk, General Deer, Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation and Base Hunting licenses. A total of 17,000 are available.

Elk Combination (\$851) General Elk, Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation and Base Hunting licenses. The available licenses are included in the 17,000 noted above.

Deer Combination (\$597) General Deer, Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation and Base Hunting licenses. A total of 4,600 are available.

Landowner Sponsored Deer Combination (\$597) Landowner Deer (valid only on landowner's property), Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation and Base Hunting licenses. A total of 2,000 are available.

2. Determine if you need a Deer or Elk permit in your hunting area. A permit and a general license are required to hunt Bull or Antlerless Elk and Buck Mule Deer in certain hunting districts.

- Your permit must be used with your General Elk or Deer hunting license. A permit is not a second license and does not allow the holder to kill an additional animal. Rather, it offers a special opportunity to hunt for a species in a particular hunting district allowing the hunter to harvest a buck mule deer, a bull elk, or an antlerless elk.
- Review the maps for elk and deer. If the hunting district where you wish to hunt indicates a permit is required, you must apply by March 15. If the map indicates that no permit is required, your General Elk or Deer license is all you need to hunt there during the 2016 archery only and general hunting seasons.
- Refer to <http://fwp.mt.gov/hunting> for legal descriptions.

3. If you apply for a Big Game or Elk Combination License—and an elk permit—you must choose from the following options if you are not awarded an elk permit via the drawing:

- Keep your Big Game or Elk Combination license, or
- Request an 80 percent refund, or
- Turn in the General Elk License portion of your Big Game Combination License and retain the Deer, Fishing, and Upland Bird licenses and receive a \$306 refund.

4. Pick the correct 5-digit elk and deer permit code and know the hunting district.

Some elk hunting districts have more than one option for a permit—for instance, HD 631 offers one for archery only and one for the general season only, while HD 380 offers one for archery and the general season. Some deer permits—like those offered in HD 213—also are valid in more than one hunting district.

Note: You must list all five digits in a permit area on your application. Failure to list all five digits will result in an invalid permit choice and will be removed from the drawing. Some HD codes have changed from past years.

5. Are you applying as a party?

NOTE: In Montana, a “party” simply means that a group of hunters are applying together for the chance to obtain hunting licenses or permits. It is illegal to transfer any hunting license. Each individual in the application “party” must harvest his or her own game.

For paper applications: Make sure:

- (1) all party members complete their own application;
- (2) all party members apply for the same hunting districts, in the same order and all party members must choose to either participate or not participate in the preference/bonus point system;
- (3) all party applications are submitted in the same envelope; if one party member makes an error, that application will be eliminated but the remaining will be processed.

For online applications: The party establisher must list all party members and provide the party number to all members. Each member must apply online as a member of that party using the number assigned to the establisher.

All party members must apply in the same manner, either online using the same party number issued to the party establisher OR all on paper submitted in the same envelope.

6. Complete your application.

For paper applications:

- Fill in date of birth, ALS #
- Complete all mandatory information
- Original signature required
- Select the license type
- For permits, fill in all 5 digits for each permit
- Double-check your math
- U.S. Postal Service postmark no later than March 15

For online applications:

- Go to <http://fwp.mt.gov>, and select “Buy a License,” at the top right of the homepage.
- Make sure you read the application packet online before you apply.

Additional Information for Nonresident Hunters

■ Apprentice Hunter

This new opportunity allows youth 10-17 years of age to obtain a certificate to hunt without completion of Hunter Education. The apprentice hunter must be accompanied by a mentor at least 21 years of age and follow the apprentice hunter rules. Apprentice hunters cannot apply for limited permit or license drawings. ■ Bow and Arrow License—\$10

In addition to a current year hunting license, a Bow and Arrow License is required to hunt during: (1) any Archery Season; or (2) to archery hunt in any "Arch-Equip Only" area or hunting district.

■ Bowhunter Education Requirements

To purchase a Montana Bow and Arrow License, a hunter must provide a certificate of completing the National Bowhunter Education Foundation course; or provide any prior year's bowhunting/archery stamp, tag, permit, or license from any state or province; or pay \$5 and sign an affidavit stating to the FWP Enforcement Division that the hunter previously held such a license.

■ Hunter Education Requirements

Any hunter who was born after January 1, 1985 must submit with all hunting license applications a copy of their certificate verifying that he/she has completed a course in hunter education from any state or province.

■ Landowner Preference

To claim landowner preference for a deer permit, a landowner must own at least 160 acres of, which is primarily for agricultural purposes within the applied for hunting district. For a landowner preference elk permit, the landowner must own or be contracting for purchase, at least 640 acres of contiguous land used by elk and verified by FWP, within the applied for hunting district. To obtain the required 2016 Landowner Preference application form, call 406-444-2950.

Landowner preference only applies to your 1st choice. If using landowner preference, you cannot apply as a party.

■ Youth Hunter Requirements

Youth who have completed Hunter Education, and who will turn 12 years of age before Jan. 16, 2017, may purchase or apply for licenses and hunt after Aug. 15, 2016.

Tips for a successful application

■ Permit drawing choices

- ▶ Your first choice is required, second and third choices are optional. Note: If you have only one choice do not repeat the choice as second and third options.
- ▶ Your second or third choices will only be considered if there is a quota remaining or if the quota is unlimited and allows second or third choice applicants.
- ▶ Your best chance to use your second or third choice is if you choose a permit where drawing odds are 100 percent or unlimited and allow second or third choices.

■ Check your odds of drawing a permit

- ▶ The general drawing statistics for elk and deer permits are located below the deer and elk hunting district maps included in this application packet.

■ Preference Points and Bonus Points

Preference Points increase the likelihood of obtaining a combination license.

- ▶ Preference points essentially move you ahead in line.
- ▶ For instance, a person with three preference points is in front of the person with two, and so on.
- ▶ 75 percent of all combination licenses awarded via the drawing will be issued to hunters with preference points.
- ▶ All preference points accumulate over time until you obtain a combination license.
- ▶ If you wish to participate in the Preference Point Program for your combination license, make sure to check "YES" on the Preference Point question and include the \$50 fee.

- ▶ Preference points accumulated will be used during the current drawing whether you purchase an additional preference point or not. Any accumulated preference points are lost after two years of not applying for a Nonresident Combination License.

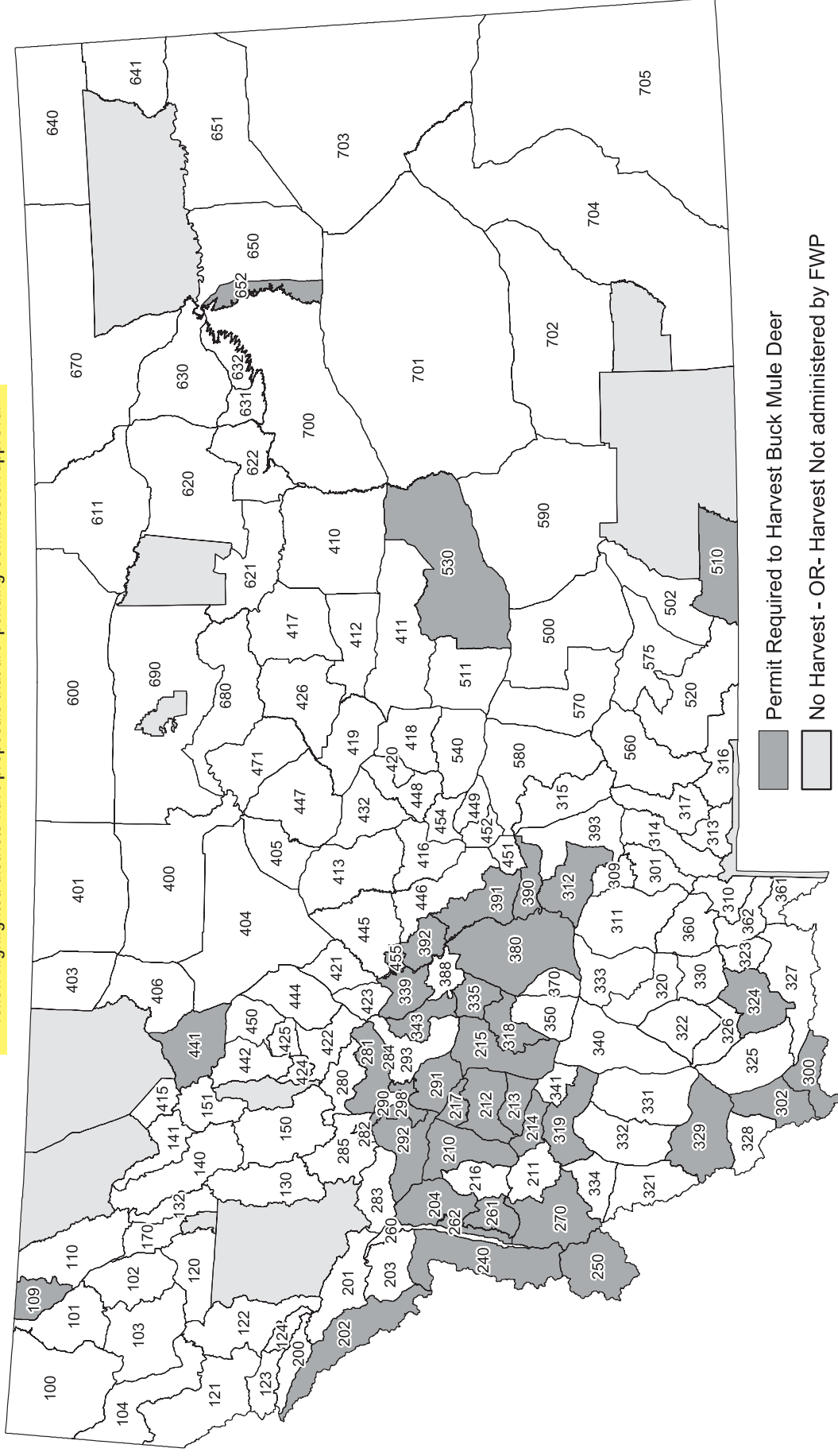
Bonus Points can increase your chances to draw a buck mule deer, bull elk, or antlerless elk permit.

- ▶ Bonus points offer you additional drawing chances.
- ▶ Existing base bonus points will be mathematically "squared" prior to the drawing.
- ▶ That means if you already have three "base" bonus points those will be "squared" and you'll then have nine bonus points going into the 2016 drawing.
- ▶ If you're unsuccessful, you'll be awarded an additional base bonus point for next year's drawing.
- ▶ If you wish to participate in the Bonus Point Program for deer/elk permits, make sure to check "YES" on the Bonus Point questions and include the \$20 Bonus Point fee for each permit or license type.
- ▶ All "base" bonus points accumulate over time until you obtain a permit.
- ▶ An applicant may skip two consecutive years of participation without forfeiting accumulated points. If an applicant misses the third year, all accumulated points for that license/permit type are lost.
- ▶ The base bonus points for a party are the average of their individual base bonus points rounded to the nearest whole number.

Deer Permits Apply by March 15

- Hunters who receive a deer permit must use it with a current general deer license. A deer permit does not allow you to take a second deer.
- Hunters who receive a deer permit valid for taking an antlered buck mule deer (with their general deer license) are restricted to taking an antlered buck mule deer only in the district or portion of district specified on the permit. They may not hunt antlered buck mule deer anywhere else in Montana even if the General Season or Archery Only Season is open to mule deer buck hunting with a general deer license. This applies to all deer permit areas, whether limited or unlimited, for antlered buck mule deer.

- Up to 10% of a quota may be issued to nonresidents. If you apply for a permit area that has less than a quota of 10, your permit application will be considered invalid and removed from the drawing.
- Permits and licenses are labeled with three-digits followed by a dash and then two-digits (such as "213-50"). The first three digits may identify the hunting district, and the last two digits are FWP codes for additional opportunities related to that license or permit. **Use all five digits.** Hunting districts in which the permit is valid are listed in column 3.
- Permits or quotas that are highlighted with yellow are pending adoption by the F&W Commission. You must check the web on Feb 16, 2016 at <http://fwp.mt.gov> or contact the License Bureau at 406-444-2950 for the final Commission decisions.

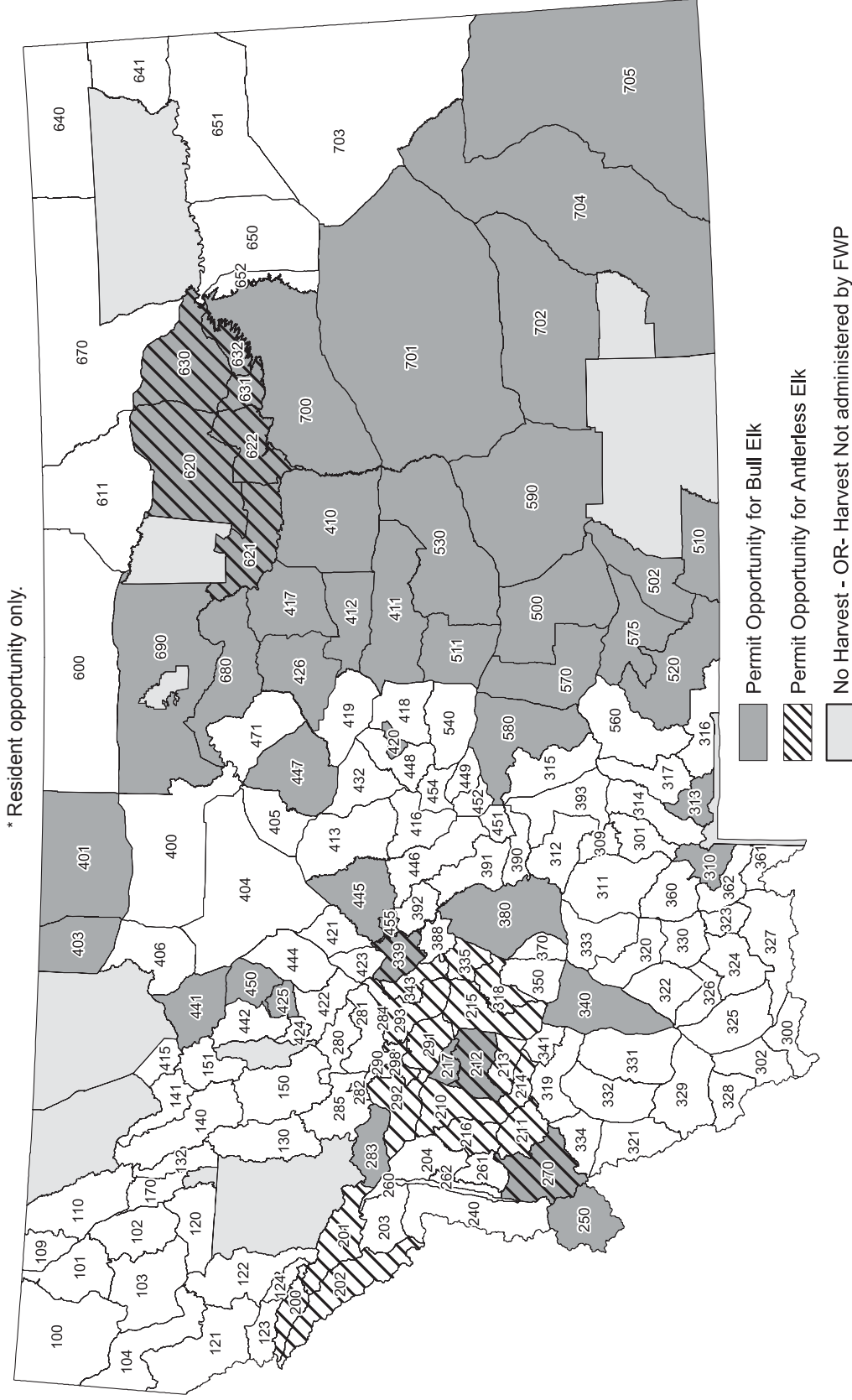

Elk Permits. Apply by March 15

- Hunters who receive an elk permit must use it with a current general elk license. An elk permit does not allow you to take a second elk.
- Elk permits, allotted by drawings, allow you to hunt in a restricted area or time period or to harvest a bull or antlerless where harvest restrictions exist for hunters who have only a general elk license.
- Permits and licenses are labeled with three-digits followed by a dash and then two-digits (such as "212-45"). The first three digits may identify the hunting district, and the last two digits are FWP codes for additional opportunities related to that license or permit. **Use all five digits.** Hunting districts in which the permit is valid are listed in column 3.
- Up to 10% of a quota may be issued to nonresidents. Nonresidents may not apply for any districts with less than 10 permits in the quota. If you apply for a permit area that has less than a quota of 10, your permit application will be considered invalid and removed from the drawing. Only valid choices are shown below.

- ▶ Big Game Combination (\$510.50) Includes General Deer and Elk, Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation license and Base Hunting License. A total of 500 are available.
- ▶ Deer Combination (\$308.50) Includes General Deer, Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation license and Base Hunting License. A total of 500 are available.

■ Youth Combination (\$505.50)

Includes General Elk and Deer, Upland Game Bird, Fishing, Conservation license and Base Hunting License. There is no sales limit quota. Youth must be at least 12 and under 18 years of age (at the time the application is processed) with a sponsor who is a natural or adoptive parent, grandparent—

or adult brother, or sister—who also holds a 2016 resident or nonresident general deer or elk license. The youth must hunt with the licensed sponsor. Applications are available online at <http://fwp.mt.gov> and must be issued through FWP's Headquarters in Helena.

For those interested in applying for deer and/or elk permit(s) as a party with a youth that is also applying for a nonresident youth combination; please read and follow these instructions:

- All applications (combination, permit and youth) must be submitted in the same envelope.
- Youth applicant must have separate payment.
- If the sponsor is unsuccessful in drawing the combination, the youth application and payment will be returned to them.
- If the sponsor is a resident, they must hold a 2016 general deer or elk license.

■ Apprentice Hunter

Is a new opportunity that allows youth 10-17 years of age, to obtain a certificate to hunt without completion of Hunters Education. The Apprentice hunter must be accompanied by a mentor at least 21 years of age and follow the rules outlined for the apprentice hunter. Apprentice hunters cannot apply for limited drawings.
